We are saddened to hear the passing of one our members and ex-WASP on 8/20/11 - age 95.

Lt. Col. Leonora (Nonie) Horton Anderson

Born Leonora Horton on Dec. 1, 1916 in Toronto, Canada. In 1923 her family moved to New York City. She received a B.A in Physiology from Hunter College and her Masters degree from NYU. In 1938 she earned her private flying license before joining the WASPS in 1943. She was a member of the WASP class: 43-7. After the war, Nonie settled in Washington DC where she was a Physical Ed teacher and a flight instructor. Throughout her lifetime, she held various jobs such as: selling Cessna planes, public relations writer and photographer for Fairchild Engine, assistant editor for Shell Oil Company, writer for TWA airlines-traveling all over the world for TWA. In 1977, Nonie retired from the Air Force as a Lt. Col. and was awarded the Meritorious Service Award for her national publicity programs at the Pentagon. In her later years she continued teaching. Nonie is predeceased by her husband, Alex Anderson, a Navy Ace.

Marilyn called the meeting to order at 10:20. Motion was made to pass the Secretary minutes as posted, a second was called, and the minutes were passed. Denise Rosenberger did a patch for the quilt which was passed around. Very nice.

Committee Reports:

Getting speakers for various seminars, hotel arrangements/deals, catering and attraction discounts are just a few. Even though, according to International, TPI does all the set up we would still need many volunteers and at this time it was decided we do not have the woman power to proceed with the bid.

We have tickets to sell for an Ipad drawing on October 15. Money generated from this will go toward the cost for filing for Tax Exempt status. Members were asked to take tickets to sell and bring unsold tickets to the October meeting.

Membership drive: the plastic holders for our brochures are in. Marilyn passed around a sign up sheet for volunteers to take these to different airports in the area to advertise the 99s. Information on the upcoming poker run and about scholarships were also provided to post at airports.

Nancy Wright brought up the notion to pay for Marilyn registration to go to the section meeting. Question was asked if we have a budget for this year. The annual report did not mention a budget. Nancy made a motion that we do this, Laura Gao second, and motion was carried for sending Marilyn to the section meeting.

Ms. Rosenberger sits on the City Council for Florida Airpark. She will be doing air safety meetings again. The hours for the airport have been extended until 11:00 pm.
